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IBDP, BTEC and Stamford courses are offered to students in Grades 11-12. AP courses are offered to students from Grades 10-12. Stamford students are limited to taking a maximum of 4 advanced courses per year (AP and IB HL courses). IBDP students are restricted to three Higher Level courses.

Grade 6 to 10 students who are English Language Learners may choose to join Stamford by first attending our intensive Preparatory Course for Secondary (PCS), in order to improve their academic English to meet the rigor of the secondary curriculum. Students are permitted to study either one or two semesters within PCS before graduating into their appropriate Grade level program.

All students in Grades 9 and 10 are enrolled in the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IB MYP), as a part of the IB Continuum at SAIS. As MYP students, our Grade 10s have the option to register for the MYP Certificate or MYP Courses to enhance their HS diploma. Throughout the programme our students engage in contexts and approaches to learning as a tool for academic success. Grade 10 students have the option to choose the flexible MYP pathway (MYP Flex) and choose one (1) AP course within their student schedule. This allows students to continue learning in the MYP while beginning to explore options for flexible pathway options in Grades 11 and 12.

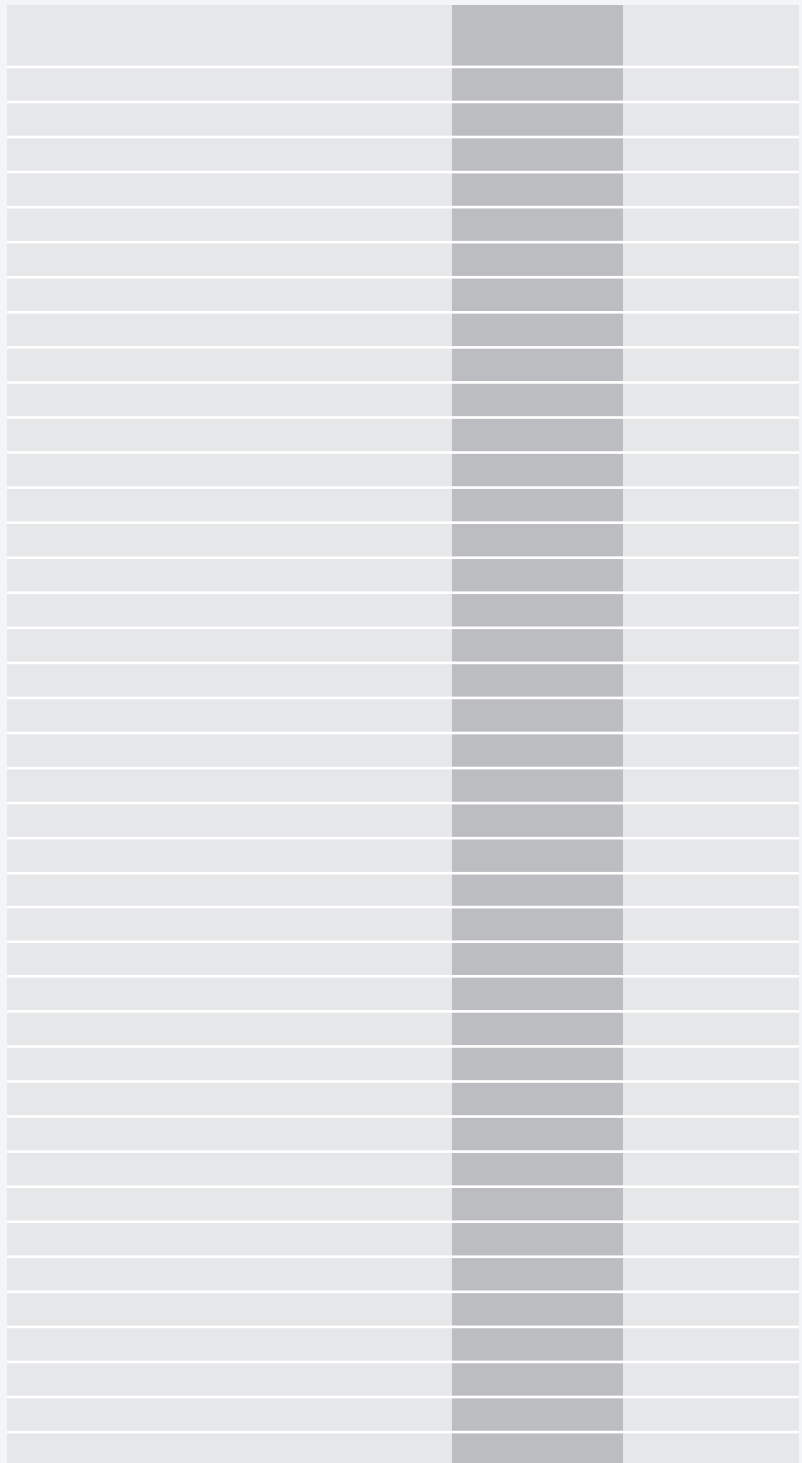
Academic counseling begins for students in Grade 9. Students in Grades 11 and 12 have the option to pursue the IB DP or an individualized academic pathway. Stamford is the first and only school in Singapore to offer the American Advanced Placement, BTEC International Level 3 and International Baccalaureate Diploma Curricula.

Stamford students have the opportunity to take a blend of IB, BTEC, AP and/or Stamford College Preparatory courses to work towards the Stamford High School Diploma. This offers flexibility and choice for students in choosing their courses and rigor. Students in the individualized pathway also have the opportunity to take IB or AP external examinations. Students in the BTEC Diploma are more restricted to the courses they may take depending on the type of diploma they are working towards.

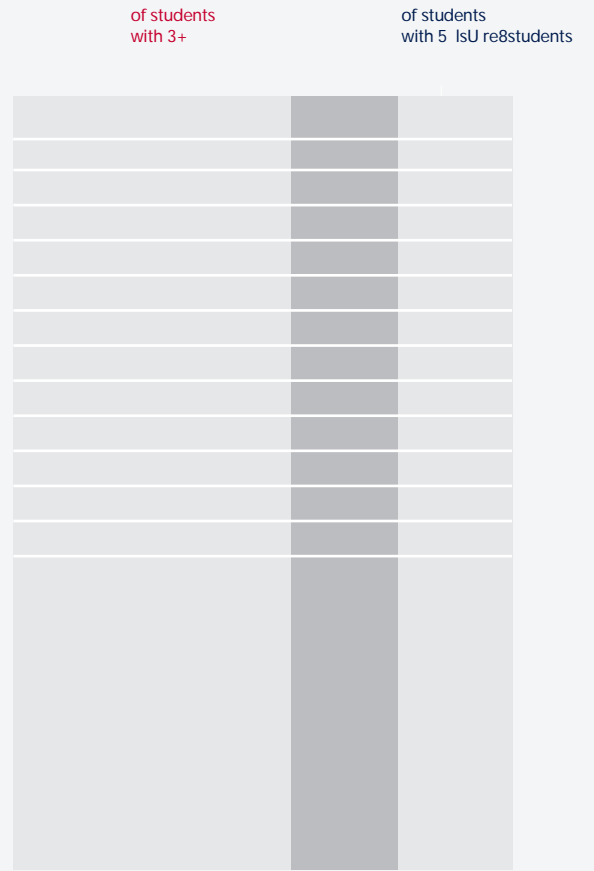
Students at Stamford are not ranked, nor do we calculate GPA. For schools requiring GPA we suggest the following equivalency: students taking IBDP Standard Level (SL) and Theory of Knowledge working towards.

IB Diploma candidates must also complete the IBDP Core, which consists of Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS), and the Extended Essay (EE). Stamford HS Diploma students can choose to pursue IBDP Course Certificates, enabling them to sit selected IBDP examinations and not complete the Extended Essay.
